Along the way, he has encountered both racism and discrimination, and as a result he has been constantly asking himself the question, "where do I belong?" A British born, Rinkoo discovered at the age of three that not only was he required to tick the box, 'ethnic minority,' but also the box, 'Deaf.'

Made In India Britain is an insight into one man's life as he tries to fathom out exactly who he is and where he belongs, as he delves deep into past experiences to try and find clues which will ultimately help him realise his true self and a home he can finally call home.

Rinkoo's mother was from Africa and his dad from the Punjab. Rinkoo's story is about growing up deaf, describing his experiences from an early age, right up until the present day.

Inspired by his mother's storytelling and Director Daniel Bailey; Rinkoo transforms his experience's into theatre. Rinkoo tells a story that is common to many second-generation migrants living in urban locations. He story will resonate with communities living in Britain. The performance will be accessible to Deaf and hearing audiences.

Profile Rinkoo Barpaga

Rinkoo Barpaga is a creative, adept at street photography capturing portraits of hidden people on the street. He has a keen visual eye, his work is a conversation and in his stand up comedy you can see his confidence in the hearing world. Rinkoo inspires deaf people. Rinkoo made an award winning documentary "Double Discrimination" he interviewed young people; using urban sign language to describe race discrimination. During "Black Live Matters" this pioneering work has received much attention. Rinkoo is brave, and willing to use his art practice, to tackle taboo subjects & confront audiences with difficult issues.

In 2015 he received a grant to make a show about Stand Up Comedy called "Am I funny"; the life and signs of a Deaf comedian; eight sold out shows at Mac Birmingham, Wolverhampton Arena, Etcetera Theatre, and First Festival (Tristan Bates Theatre) London. In 2018, Rinkoo went on to The REP theatre's Foundry for new Theatre Makers in West Midlands. In March 2019 he performed at Sprint festival at Camden Peoples Theatre and in 2020 at Crystal Palace Festival. In early 2020 he was awarded an Offsite - Outdoor Arts commission and in summer 2021 he collaborated with Open Theatre's, Richard Hayhow to make a new outdoor work for family audiences called Remote Control.
